

## Reggae Boyz undergo medical examination

Members of Jamaica's national senior football squad, which assembled at Superclubs Resort Grand Lido Braco on Monday, underwent medical tests under the supervision of Brazilian doctor, Rajero Neves.

The tests included testing the players' stress level, body fluids and height versus weight.

The squad preparing for upcoming friendlies and the CONCACAF Caribbean World Cup qualifiers was boosted on Monday afternoon with the arrival of five overseas based players.

This included first time invitees Lee Trevor Williamson, a 25-year-old midfielder of English Championship Club Watford, and Simon Ford, a 26-year-old defender of Scottish Premiership Club Kilmarnock.

New Reggae Boy Ford has been described as a version of 'Durrent & Tatty' Brown, who was a key member of the historic 1998 World Cup squad to France.

Also arriving on Monday were Deon Burton, Jamal Campbell-Ryce, Marlon King and Richard Langly of English Club Luton Town, who last played for the Reggae Boys in 2004.

The eight local based players including first time invitee Reno mid fielder Evan Taylor along with the other overseas based players Ricardo Fuller, Luton Shelton, Ian Goodison, Claude Davis, Ricardo Gardner, Omar Daley, Jermaine Johnson, Demar Stewart and Demar Phillips are already in camp in Trelawny.

The Reggae Boyz will contest friendlies against St. Vincent & the Grenadines on June 3; against Trinidad and Tobago on June 7 and against Grenada on June 10.

These are before the World Cup qualifiers against the Bahamas on June 15 and 18.
